

- 119:92 -- "If Thy law had not been my delight,  
Then I would have perished in my affliction."
- 119:97 -- "O how I love Thy law!  
It is my meditation all the day."
- 119:109 - "My life is continually in my hand,  
Yet I do not forget Thy law."
- 119:113 - "I hate those who are double-minded,  
But I love Thy law."
- 119:126 - "It is time for the Lord to act,  
For they have broken Thy law."
- 119:136 - "My eyes shed streams of water,  
Because they do not keep Thy law."
- 119:142 - "Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness,  
And Thy law is truth."
- 119:150 - "Those who follow after wickedness draw near;  
They are far from Thy law."
- 119:153 - "Look upon my affliction and rescue me,  
For I do not forget Thy law."
- 119:163 - "I hate and despise falsehood,  
But I love Thy law."
- 119:165 - "Those who love Thy law have great peace,  
And nothing causes them to stumble."
- 119:174 - "I long for Thy salvation, O Lord,  
And Thy law is my delight."

Note: All of these instances translate TORAH. But also note other terms scattered throughout this Psalm: "testimonies," "precepts," "statutes," "commandments," "judgments," and "ordinances."

It is also instructive to note that these uses of "law of God" are very close in meaning to the uses of "word of God" in this same Psalm:

References to the DAVAR ( דָּבָר ) of God:

- 119:9 --- "How can a young man keep his way pure?  
By keeping it according to Thy word."
- 119:16 -- "I shall delight in Thy statutes;  
I shall not forget Thy word."
- 119:17 -- "Deal bountifully with Thy servant,  
That I may live and keep Thy word."
- 119:25 -- "My soul cleaves to the dust;  
Revive me according to Thy word."
