- 119:97 -- "O how I love Thy law! It is my meditation all the day."
- 119:109 "My life is continually in my hand, Yet I do not forget Thy law."
- 119:113 "I hate those who are double-minded, But I love Thy law."
- 119:126 "It is time for the Lord to act, For they have broken Thy law."
- 119:136 "My eyes shed streams of water, Because they do not keep Thy law."
- 119:142 "Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, And Thy law is truth."
- 119:150 "Those who follow after wickedness draw near; They are far from Thy law."
- 119:153 "Look upon my affliction and rescue me, For I do not forget Thy law."
- 119:163 "I hate and despise falsehood, But I love Thy law."
- 119:165 "Those who love Thy law have great peace, And nothing causes them to stumble."
- 119:174 "I long for Thy salvation, O Lord, And Thy law is my delight."
- Note: All of these instances translate TORAH. But also note other terms scattered throughout this Psalm: "testimonies," "precepts," "statutes," "commandments," "judgments," and "ordinances."
- It is also instructive to note that these uses of "law of God? are very close in meaning to the uses of "word of God" in this same Psalm:

References to the DAVAR (ヿユヿ) of God:

- 119:9 --- "How can a young man keep his way pure? By keeping it according to Thy word."
- 119:17 -- "Deal bountifully with Thy servant, That I may live and keep Thy word."
- 119:25 -- "My soul cleaves to the dust; Revive me according to Thy word."
