Matthew 12:9-12 -- "And departing from there, He went into their synagogue. And behold, there was a man with a withered hand. And they questioned Him, saying, 'Is it <u>lawful</u> to heal on the Sabbath?' -- in order that they might accuse Him. And He said to them, 'What man shall there be among you, who shall have one sheep, and if it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will he not take hold of it, and lift it out? Of how much more value then is a man than a sheep! So then, it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath.' " (T), (ML)

Matthew 14:3-4 -- "For when Herod had John arrested, he bound him, and put him in prison on account of Herodias, the wife of his brother Philip. Fer John had been saying to him, "It is not lawful for you to have her." (ML)

Matthew 19:3 -- "And some Pharisees came to Him, testing Him, and saying, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any cause at all?" (T)

Matthew 20:13-15 -- "But he (the owner of the vineyard) answered and said to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for a denarius? Take what is yours and go your way, but I wish to give to this last man the same as to you. Is it not lawful for me to do what I wish with what is my own? Or is your eye envisus because I am generous?' "(ML) or (P)

Matthew 27:5-6 -- "And he (Judas Iscariot) threw the pieces of silver into the sanctuary and departed; and he went away and hanged himself. And the chief priests took the pieces of silver and said, 'It is not lawful to put them into the temple treasury, since it is the price of blood.' "(T)

Mark 2:23-24 -- "And it came about that He was passing through the grain-fields on the Sabbath, and His disciples began to make their way along while picking the heads of grain. And the Pharisees were saying to Him, 'See here, why are they doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?' " (T)

Mark 2:25-26 -- "And He (Jesus) said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he was in need and became hungry, he and his companions; how he entered the house of God in the time of Abiathar the priest, and ate the consecrated bread, which is not <u>lawful</u> for anyone to eat except the priests, and he gave it also to those who were with him?" " (ML)

Mark 3:1-4 -- "And He entered again into a synagogue; and a man was there with a withered hand. And they were watching Him to see if He would heal him on the Sabbath, in order that they might accuse Him. And He said to the man with the withered hand, 'Rise and come forward!' And He said to them, 'Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do good or to do harm, to save a life or to kill?' But they kept silent." (ML)

Mark 6:17-18 -- "For Hered himself had sent and had John arrested and bound in prison on account of Heredias, the wife of his brother Philip, because he had married her. For John had been saying to Hered, "It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife." (ML)

Mark 10:2 -- "And some Pharisees came up to Him, testing Him, and began to question Him whether it was lawful for a man to divorce his wife." (T)

Mark 12:13-14 -- "And they sent seme of the Pharisees and Herodians to Him, in order to trap Him in a statement. And they came and said to Him, 'Teacher, we know that You are truthful, and defer to no one; for You are not partial to any, but teach the way of God in truth. Is it lawful to
