Jew."

Sometimes "call" means to cry out or pray, as in Romans 10:12 - "the Lord richly blesses all who call on Him."

Sometimes "call" refers to a trumpet alert, as in 1 Corinthians 14:8 or 1 Thessalonians 4:16.

Sometimes "call" means to appeal to, as in 2 Corinthians 1:23 - "I call God as my witness."

Sometimes "call" means to invite or send a message to, as in James 5:14 - "call the elders of the church."

Sometimes "call" means to point out, as in 3 John 10 - "I will call attention to what he is doing."

And sometimes "call" means to summon, as in Romans 1:5 - "to call people . . . to the obedience that comes from faith," or as in 1 Thessalonians 4:7 -"God did not call us to be impure, but to live a holy life."

The word "called" as used in the Bible has all the same categories as "call" plus one or two.

Sometimes "called" means to be selected and specially qualified for a particular occupation, as in Romans 1:1 - "Paul . . . called to be an apostle and set apart for the gospel of God."

And sometimes "called" means to be summoned and actually brought into a saving relationship with Christ, as in Romans 8:28 - "those who live Him, who have been called according to His purpose"; or as in Romans 8:30 - "those He predestined, He also called; those He called, He also justified"; or as in 1 Corinthians 1:24 - "to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God"; or as in Jude 1 - "To those who have been called, who are loved by God the Father and kept by Jesus Christ"; or as in Revelation 17:14 - "They will make war against the Lamb, but the Lamb will overcome them because He is Lord of lords and King of kings – and with Him will be His called, chosen, and faithful followers."

The word "calling" is used in several categories of meaning.

Sometimes "calling" means "the act of crying out," as in Matthew 9:27 -
