1. What kinds of responses are efficient?

Given that we have limited personnel, time, effort, and funds, how can we more efficiently use these limited resources?

Should we spend all of our time, effort, and money on one issue at a time, so as to maximize our influence and attain as large a success as possible?

Should we urge individual Christians to work in as many areas as possible without concentrating on one area, so as to work on a number of fronts at the same time?

2. What kinds of responses are effective?

Have Christians made any headway on certain issues? If so, should they concentrate their efforts at those points, in order to win through to success at this time?

If we do this, will it mean that we must (temporarily) set aside our special interests and concerns, and put all of our energies into the pressure-point issues? How would this work out practically (say, for a crisis pregnancy center already existing and functioning)? Would we need to curtail or shut down some operations?
