

A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you: and I will take away the stony heart out of your flesh, and I will give you a heart of flesh.

And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes, and ye shall keep my judgments, and do them. And ye shall dwell in the land that I gave to your fathers; and ye shall be my people, and I will be your God.

I will also save you from all your uncleannesses: and I will call for the corn, and will increase it, and lay no famine upon you.

This passage predicts the future restoration, cleansing, regeneration, and indwelling of Israel by God's Spirit, resulting in Israel's keeping and doing God's will, dwelling in her own land, being in truth the people of God, and experiencing the manifest blessings of God.

Ezekiel 37: 1-14

Then he said to me, Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel: behold, they say, Our bones are dried, and our hope is lost: we are cut off from our parts. Therefore prophesy and say unto them, Thus saith the Lord God, Behold, O my people, I will open your graves, and cause you to come up out of your graves, and bring you into the land of Israel.

And ye shall know that I am the Lord, when I have opened your graves, O my people, and brought you up out of your graves. And shall put my Spirit in you, and ye shall live, and I shall place you in your own land: then shall ye know that I the Lord have spoken it, and performed it, saith the Lord.

This extended metaphor or allegory in the form of Ezekiel's vision predicts the future renewal and restoration of Israel, not only in the national sense, but also in the spiritual sense.

Ezekiel 39:29

The context of this verse runs as follows: the verses preceding the immediate context speak graphically of a great judgment which God will bring upon those who will come to destroy Israel, and of the great slaughter of armies and men which will be accomplished. Then the
