

c. Views of God's relationship to the time-space universe

Deism holds that:

God is <u>absent</u> from the universe in <u>location</u>

God and the universe are made of <u>different</u> kinds of <u>stuff</u>

God and the universe are <u>not identical</u>

Theism holds that:

God is <u>present</u> in the universe, but <u>transcends</u> it in location

God and the universe are made of <u>different</u> kinds of <u>stuff</u>

God and the universe are not identical

Panentheism holds that:

God is <u>present</u> in the universe in <u>location</u> and <u>confined</u> to it

God and the universe are made of <u>different</u> kinds of <u>stuff</u>

God and the universe are <u>not identical</u>

Pantheism holds that:

God is <u>present</u> in the universe in <u>location</u> and <u>confined</u> to it

God and the universe are made of the <u>same</u> kind of stuff

God and the universe are <u>identical</u>; God is the universe, the universe is God
