obedience to the revealed will of God, but that he must to the contrary pass this life in fear of committing sin, incurring God's condemnation, and losing salvation; that holiness consists in striving to do the revealed will of God as well as he is humanly able, and that he must not believe himself secure until God Himself assures him that he is so at the Judgment, simply does not understand the operation of grace in a believer's life.

Christ's work for us; the Spirit's work in us -- both received as gifts by faith -- that is grace operating in a believer's life!

As Horatius Bonar put it, consciousness of a perfect standing before God, perfect forgiveness of sins, and perfect peace, arising out of the free love of God in Christ, is "the root and soil of holiness".
