- D. Some thoughts on the reality of worship as viewed in this light of appreciation...
 - There is the matter of content...what we say and what we do. Worship may not be prescribed in content...there is a very individualized heart approach. But it is the building of God through the praising of His Name and Work. It is the way in which we blessGod...in which we give to Him what He does not have otherwise...our love and esteem.
 - 2. As such it is a part of the life of the believer and then a part of the life of the collect company. It is regrettable that there are those who feel collective worship is not needed...it does suggest (although we must go slowly in our judgments) that their personal worship is not every exciting... at least not meaningful enough to allow them the privilege of sharing it with others.
 - 3. But if the case for worship and the cause for its existence are held in view, there can be no doubt that the sould is at a high point when it is enjoying the praise it and kindred spirits are offering to God.
