- emphasizing positive matters as well as those in which you think help can be given.
- (4) if it is truly problematic, it becomes a matter for the elders of the local assembly.
- f. And we must remember that ultimately we do not command the Spirit and therefore at times our judgment on what is appropriate or not may be subject to review.
- 6. Some suggested steps to help one in following this leading through a meeting:
 - a. The practice of daily worship.
 - b. The study of the Word...especially for the pictures and instructions concerning the work of Christ.
 - c. Familiarization with hymns
 - d. Careful attention to all that goes on in the meeting as you are there.
 - e. And, in the broadest terms, try to gear one's mind to think of the Lord.

- a. The priesthood of believers and its effectiveness in the meeting as a means of worship depends on you--the worshipping Christian--in proper yieldedness to the Spirit of God and government under the local fellowship of Christians.
- b. Individual exercise is the key to a stimulating time of worship which, we think, not only is more glorifying to God, but is also more edifying to us.
- c. The willing character of worship suggests that an absence of participation may indicate a lack of will. (We must be careful, however, for much genuine worship is silently and privately expressed.)
